## 1. Brief Profile of the Government College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala Kangra Himachal Pradesh

Traditionally, 'Teacher' was regarded as the Oracle and the transmitter of knowledge, but now there is a paradigm shift as regards to his/her role in the field of teaching. In the 21st century, teachers are expected to invent new horizons of knowledge and help students to keep pace with the change of time. Therefore, the role of teacher today, is of paramount importance. Teachers are the edifice atop which the entire Education System stands. Therefore, to make the Educational Pyramid strong, strengthening teacher education is a must. Besides, reform and success of school education depends largely on the quality of the teachers. So, to equip the teachers with the present trends of handling the school curricula and help keep pace with the explosion of knowledge, the institute like B.Ed. has been initiated.

The Government College of Teacher Education (GCTE) Dharamshala was established in September, 1956 by the Government to meet the ever-growing demand of trained teachers. The college is since then catering to the educational needs of Pre-service and In-service teachers. It got upgraded from Government College of Education to Government College of Teacher Education by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India on 24th February, 1993.

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) have re-accredited this institution with 'B' Grade in the second cycle (May, 2015) with CGPA of 2.65. The college caters to Pre-service and In-service Teacher Trainings by conducting Induction Programmes, Teacher Training and Capacity Building Programmes, Seminars and Workshops, for In-service Teachers and Heads of Educational Institutions of six districts (Chamba, Kangra, Hamirpur, Mandi, Kullu and Lahaul & Spiti) of H.P. Various committees and cells have been established in the college for addressing the needs of the learner's viz. Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, Women Grievance Redressal Cell, Guidance-Counselling and Placement Cell etc. Extensive theoretical orientation supplemented with five months teaching practice/internship provides a healthy learning environment for the holistic and harmonious development of the prospective teachers. The Government College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala is permanently affiliated to Sardar Patel University, (SPU) Mandi recognised from National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), New Delhi.

2. Infrastructure: The college infrastructure provides excellent facilities such as interactive classrooms, well-furnished languages lab cum ICT Lab equipped with more than 20 computers, Projectors and other equipments, Library with more than 17000 + volumes, well-lighted reading room, book bank for the needy learners, different laboratories viz. Educational-Psychology Laboratory, Sciences Laboratories, Language Lab and well-furnished soundproof Multipurpose Hall with seating capacity of 250. The college also has Faculty House cum Canteen for teachers, student teachers and trainees of State and Central Institutions. The college also has Indoor and Outdoor sports facilities in the form of a volley ball court, Basket Ball Court under construction for physical development of the trainee-student-teachers.

#### 5. Number of Seats

The number of seats for admission to Two Year B.Ed. Programme is two hundred and fifty (250) i.e. 5 Units of 50 student-teachers each which is approved by NCTE inclusive of 10 (Ten) seats for In-service Teachers of Department of Education, Govt of Himachal Pradesh. However, if there is any change in the number of seats for session 2021 -2023 by Government of H.P. or NCTE, New Delhi, or Affiliating University the admission will be done accordingly.

Admission to fill up the seats of above categories will be done through EntranceTest/Merit by Affiliating Universityfollowed by Central Counselling conducted by Department of Education, H.P. University, Shimla, H.P.-5 or any nodal agency. The 200-Point State Government Reservation Roster as per (EDN H- (B) (15)-HPU15/2019 Directorate of Higher Education, Shimla-1 Dated 21st August, 2020 and Himachal Pradesh University Notification No 3-60/20-HPU (Genl.) Dated 4th December 2020 will be applicable to the student-teachers seeking admission at Government College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala. No Entrance Test for In-service Teachers required for admission. The admission schedule of GCTE, Dharamshala is notified to the student-teachers at the time of counselling.

#### 5.1 Duration (Time Frame) of Two Year B.Ed. Programme

The Two Year B.Ed. programme through regular mode shall be of a minimum period of two academic years (spread across four semesters) and a maximum of three academic years from the date of admission of the candidate. There shall be at least 100 working days in each semester exclusive of the period of examinations and admissions with 600 teaching clock hours (each working day having 6 teaching clock hours).

The minimum attendance of student-teachers shall be 80% for Theory Courses and Practicum and 90% for Field Attachments/School Internship/Practice Teaching and no relaxation will be permissible.

\*10 seats are reserved for In-services Teachers (5 seats for JBT (Junior Basic Teachers) and 5 seats for C&V (Classical & Vernacular Teachers) who are serving in the Department of Education, Govt. of H.P. with minimum five years of regular service). Admission will be made strictly on the basis of respective category wise seniority in the cadre.

6. Eligibility for Applying to the Two Year B.Ed. Programme (for Pre-service and In-service)

The candidates who are interested for seeking admission to regular Two Year B.Ed. Course in Government College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala must fulfil the following criteria:-

#### 6.1 ELIGIBILITY AND EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

- (i) The candidates with at least 50.00 percent marks or 5.01 if CGPA or Grade B if in letter Grade in the Bachelor's Degree (Medical/Non-Medical/Commerce/Arts) and/or in the Master's Degree in the Sciences/Social Sciences/Humanities/Commerce, Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55.00 percent or 5.51 if CGPA or Grade B+ if inletter Grade or any other qualification equivalent thereto.
- (ii) At least 45.00 percent or 4.51 if CGPA, if in the letter Grade in case of SC/ST/OBC/Physically handicapped categories in the aforesaid Bachelor's/ Master's Degree and 50.00 percent marks or 5.01 if CGPA or Grade B for Bachelor's in Engineering or technology from a recognized University established by law in India are eligible for admission in the programme.

#### Note:

- (i) No relaxation, even 0.01 percent in the above prescribed percentage of marks shall be granted under any circumstances.
- (ii) Pursuant to the Judgment delivered in CWP No. 2465/2018 & CWP No. 2475/2018 by the Hon'ble High Court of Himachal Pradesh with regard to subject combinations in various streams such as Medical/Non-Medical/Arts/Commerce, the existing rules have been modified in conformity with the R&P Rules of the State Government. However, merely awarding the degree of B.Ed. by the H.P. University shall not be construed as a 12 declaration of eligibility of the candidates for the appointment to the post of TGT in Government Sector and to determine the eligibility to such post shall rest upon the concerned appointing authorities of the State Government.
- 6.2 The candidates who have appeared in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. final year or Master's Degree, Bachelor of Engineering/Technology or any other qualification equivalent thereto examination and the result of the same has not yet been declared, can also apply for B.Ed. Entrance Test. However, the admission of such candidates will be depending upon the production of certificate of qualifying examination with required percentage of aggregate marks in the aforesaid examinations as per the eligibility clause of the prospectus. In case, a candidate does not fulfil the eligibility conditions, he/she will have no right for admission to the B.Ed. course. As such, the candidate shall appear provisionally at his/her risk & responsibility.
- 6.3 Post-graduation is considered only to make those candidates eligible who are not eligible on the basis of qualifying examination but the post-graduation will not be the merit criteria.
- 6.4 The reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/Ex-serviceman and Physically handicapped categories will be as per the existing rules of Himachal Pradesh Government.
- 6.5 The 85% seats are reserved for the candidates of Bonafide/Domicile resident of Himachal Pradesh and 15% will be open to the candidates of other States /UTs of India. It is compulsory for all the candidates to produce bonafide /domicile certificate at the time of admission.
- 6.6 The college has NO Management Quota / Self Finance Seats.

#### 7. Eligibility for applying to the Two Year B.Ed. Programme

Age: There is no upper age limit for candidates applying to the regular B.Ed. Course of Two Years (High Court orders in LPA No.: 104 of 2012 decided on August 27, 2012).

- i. It is compulsory for all the candidates to produce bonafide /domicile certificate (within State/Other State) at the time of admission.
- ii. Admission to the Two Year B. Ed. Course (Regular Mode) is subject based and candidates should have the below mentioned combinations of subject at the graduation level.

- iii. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure that he/she has studied the below mentioned subject combinations at graduation level.
- a) At the time of admission, each candidate shall opt for two teaching subjects. A candidate can opt only those teaching subjects, which he/she has studied at graduation/ post-graduation level. The candidate must have studied the subjects / subject combinations for at least three years at Bachelor's level and two years at Master's level.
- b) Honour's students shall opt for teaching subjects (one major subject in whom they have obtained honours, and other subsidiary subjects who should have been studied for at least one year.
- c) In case of CBCS (RUSA), one major and one minor subject which should have been studied at least for three years or six semesters.
- d) The candidates who have passed additional subjects at graduation level can opt for only those teaching subjects, marks of which are taken into account for the purpose of calculating percentage of marks at graduation level.

#### The following will be the combination of teaching subjects for the students of different streams:

- I. **B.Com./M.Com.** graduates shall opt for following two teaching subjects:
  - a) Teaching of one of the languages i.e. English/Hindi/Sanskrit
  - b) Teaching of Commerce
- II. **B.Sc.** (Medical) graduates shall opt for the following two teaching subjects:
  - a) Teaching of Life Sciences
  - b) Teaching of Physical Sciences
- III. **B.Sc. (Non-Medical)** graduates shall opt for the following two teaching subjects:
  - a) Teaching of Mathematics
  - b) Teaching of Physical Sciences
- IV. **B.A.** (Arts Graduates) shall opt for two teaching subjects out of the following:
  - a) Teaching of Social Sciences: Teaching of Social Sciences shall be opted by the candidates who have taken any one of the following subjects at B.A./M.A. level:
  - 1) History 2) Geography 3) Political Science 4) Sociology 5) Economics
  - 6) Public Administration

OR

Teaching of Mathematics: It shall be opted by the candidates who have taken Mathematics as one of the subjects at their graduation level/ in accordance with RUSA system.

- b) Teaching of any one of the languages i.e. English, Hindi and Sanskrit provided the candidate has studied the subject at the graduation level <u>at least for three years in accordance with RUSA system.</u>
- Note: No admission shall be allowed beyond the above said subject combination under any circumstances. In case any admission is made beyond the above said subject combination, the colleges concerned shall be held responsible.

#### .8. Procedure to Apply for admission in GCTE

#### 8.1. For In-service Teachers

- i. In-service Teachers are not required to appear in B.Ed. Entrance Test conducted by HPU Shimla-5 or any Nodal Agency.
- ii. Interested In-service Teachers of categories mentioned in section 5 above are required to apply on the prescribed application form for admission to the B.Ed. Programme in GCTE (2022-2024) directly to the Principal G.C.T.E, Dharamshala.
- iii. Hand Book of Information containing application form can be obtained from the College Office on payment of ₹ 300/- at the college counter and ₹ 350/- through Registered Post.
- iv. The last date for submission of the application form for In-service Teachers for Two Year B.Ed. Programme shall be communicated through the advertisement published in Newspapers from time to time.
- v. All the copies of supporting documents attached as mentioned in the application form should be self-attested.
- vi. In-service Teachers need to submit a character certificate issued by head of the institute in which they are serving.
- vii. In-service Teachers who have obtained the last degree from a University other than Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla need to submit the original Migration Certificate in the college office within one month from the date of admission.
- viii. Other than the documents mentioned in the application form, In-service Teachers (Working in H.P. Government Schools) also need to submit verified date of joining in the concerned cadre and the cadre seniority number along with the departmental permission to undergo the training at the time of seeking admission.
- ix. Incomplete application form will be rejected and no communication in this regard shall be entertained.

#### 8.2. For Pre-Service Teachers

- i. The candidate who has been allotted GCTE, Dharamshala by the Central Counselling, H.P. Shimla shall have to apply on the prescribed Application Form for admission to the Two Year B.Ed. Programme (Regular Mode) in GCTE Dharamshala.
- ii. The admission form along with the college prospectus can be obtained from the college counter during working hours on payment of ₹300/-and for ₹350/- through registered post after attending the Central Counselling online/offline mode.
- iii. Candidate seeking admission in GCTE, Dharamshala must go through the instructions to fill the admission form(s) and follow the sequence of documents to be attached along with the Form.
- iv. The form must be accompanied with self-attested photostat copies of relevant supporting documents mentioned in the application form-attached.
- v. Candidates are required to submit original Character Certificate from the last institution attended (if there is a gap of more than six months from the institution last attended a Character Certificate from respective Tehsildar/SDM is to be submitted).
- vi. Candidate who has obtained the last degree from University, other than Himachal Pradesh University, need to submit the original Migration Certificate in the college office within one month from the date of admission

#### 11. Re-Admission / Withdrawal

- (i) The name of a student-teacher will be struck off from the college rolls, if he/she remains absent from the Morning Assembly/Theory Classes/Lab-Practical's /Activity classes continuously for six days without prior permission/approval of Tutor/Principal or for any act of indiscipline and hooliganism.
- (ii) A student-teacher can seek re-admission within four days from the date on which his/her name stands struck off, after satisfying the authorities and paying the due charges.
- (iii) A student-teacher can seek re-admission only once during the Two Year B.Ed. Programme.
- (iv) Any student-teacher desirous of leaving the Two Year B.Ed. Programme will have to give in writing along with the consent of parents/guardian also.
- (v) Withdrawal is allowed only if the student-teacher has paid all the fine/dues due towards him/her.

#### 12. College Identity Card

The college shall issue Identity Card to every bonafide student-teacher of the institution along with the Name Tag Card on payment basis.

The student-teacher will always wear the Name Tag Card during his/her presence all time in college campus. It has to be shown on demand to any official of the institution. In case of loss of the Identity Card/ Name Tag Card, duplicate Identity Card/ Name Tag Card will be issued to the student-teacher only once in Two Year on the payment of ₹100/- (₹One hundred).

#### 13. Dress Code

- i. Dress code for male and female student-teachers of Two Year B.Ed. Programme shall be notified on the College Notice Board along with the specimen of the cloth at the time of admission.
- ii. It is mandatory for each and every student-teacher to follow the recommended Dress Code (uniform) by the institution during college working hours, examinations, functions etc. held within college campus and outside the college campus, while representing the institution in events organized by other colleges/ institutions and in both phases of School Internship Programme in Schools.

#### 14. College Library

The Government College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala has a rich and well established library having more than 17,000 books satisfying the academic needs of educational training. Library has various academic books, encyclopaedias, reference books and general books of reader's interest. Presently college library subscribes to more than 34 magazines, 4 journals and 10 leading newspapers in Hindi and English for its users. Books are issued to the student-teachers under college/library rules, which are notified on the Library Notice Board from time to time. Reading room is also available for the staff and student-teachers of the institution.

#### 15. College Magazine

In order to develop creative, constructive, aesthetic and expressive capability of the student-teachers' college publishes an annual magazine the "Dhauladhar". Student-teacher editors for the magazine are selected through a rigorous process and are mentored by the staff of Govt. College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala. Since the magazine has a limited space, only original, creative and quality entries are

given space in the student-teacher's magazine. Student-teachers can submit their original articles before 15<sup>th</sup> March of every year or as notified by the college authorities from time to time.

#### 16. Girls' Hostel

The college has a Girl's Hostel adjacent to the college campus, with an intake of 69 girl student-teachers. A detail of seats for the session 2021-23 is available in Girls' Hostel Prospectus and Hostel Warden can be consulted for any further details. Admission to the Girl's Hostel is granted according to the merit & norms framed by the college authorities. **Girl's Hostel facility is not available to married women.**

#### 18. Houses

In order to inculcate healthy competitive spirit and prepare the student teachers for their professional roles, college has four houses: Rabindranath Tagore House, Swami Vivekananda House, Mahatma Gandhi House and Abdul Kalam House. These houses are headed by the staff member, student-teachers take up the responsibilities of House Captains and House Vice-Captains to coordinate various activities. Annually the "Overall Best House" trophy is presented to the outstanding House.

#### 19. Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell

The Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell are established to provide academic and career guidance and counselling to the student-teachers from time to time. Interactive lectures on career guidance, overall personality development and Life skill development are organized by the cell from time to time.

#### 20. Environment Club

To create awareness among the student-teachers regarding environment issues, Environment Club has been formed in the college. Each and every student-teacher is required to participate in the environment activities undertaken by Environment Club/Authorities in the college campus and outside the campus from time to time.

#### 21. Blood Donation Club

The college also has a very active and enthusiastic Blood Donation Club where various activities are taken up by the members to spread the motivation to donate blood apart from blood donation by the teachers and student-teachers.

#### 22. Rovers and Rangers

The college provides excellent opportunity for enrolment to Rovers and Rangers under the aegis of Bharat Scouts & Guides Association. The enrolment will be made in the beginning of academic session and registered members can compete for "Rashtrapati Award / Up-Rashtrapati Award".

The membership fee of this association is ₹500/- (₹ Five Hundred) which is collected at the time of admission. The amount collected in the form of membership fee is spent on the development activities of the college. Every member of PTA is required to attend the General House meeting of the association as per notified dates. The date and time of such meeting would be intimated at the time of counselling/admission. PTA membership form needed to be filled up by the parents is enclosed with prospectus.

#### 26. Old Student-Teachers' Association

The old student-teachers of this institution have formed an association known as Old Student-Teachers' Association (OSA). The life membership fee of this association is ₹300/-. The OSA organizes re-union meets, interactive lectures with the student teachers and give suggestions for the improvement of infrastructural and academic improvement.

#### 27. College Students Central Association CSCA

To give representation to the students in the college affairs, the college student body called CSCA will be nominated as per norms and directions of HPU Shimla / SPU Mandi. It will be formed as per the recommendations of Lyngdoh Committee.

#### 28. Evaluation

The performance of a student-teacher in each Programme will be evaluated in terms of percentage of marks with a provision for conversion to grade points. Evaluation for each Programme shall be done through Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) by the concerned Programme Teacher and End Semester Examination and will be consolidated at the end of the Programme. The evaluation system

of the student-teachers has the following two components:

- 1. Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 20% (Internal Evaluation) of the total marks assigned to a particular Programme.
- 2. End-Semester Examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 80% (External Evaluation) of the total marks assigned to a particular Programme.

#### 28.1 Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)

This would include the following components:

Classroom Attendance: Each student-teacher shall have to attend a minimum of 80% Lectures/Tutorial/Practical and a minimum of 90% in School Internship Programme (Cycle I and II) A student-teacher having less than 80% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination (ESE). However, the exemption from 80% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities to the extent of 20% (making the necessary attendance as 55% in these cases). The claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned University/College authorities. The student-teachers having attendance between 79% and 70% attendance may apply for exemption on a prescribed form accompanied by clear reasons for absence to the competent authority. Those student teachers getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co-curricular activities will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.

**28.2** Classroom Attendance Incentive: Those having greater than 80% attendance (for those participating in co-curricular activities, 20% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

>80% but < 84%	01 Mark
>85% but < 89%	02 Marks
>90% but < 94%	04 Marks
>95%	05 Marks

The marks on the basis of attendance (in case of courses with a total of 50 marks) will be awarded as follows:

80% but <86%	1 Mark
87% but <93%	2 Marks
94% and above	3 Marks

**28.3 Mid Term Test:** There will be One Mid-Term Test, after 60 teaching Days (10 weeks) covering at least 50% of the syllabus covered so far. The Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) will have the following components:

- 28.4 End Semester Examination: The remaining 80% of the final marks assigned to a student in a Programme will be on the basis of an End Semester Examination (ESE) that will be for three hours and one and half hour duration depending upon the marks assigned to the Paper. The ESE will be covering the whole syllabus of the B.Ed. Programme. It shall be necessary for a student-teacher to pass separately in Internal and External Examinations. A Student-teacher must obtain not less than 40% of the total number of marks in each Programme and 45% marks in aggregate of all the prescribed B.Ed. Programme.
- 28.5 School Internship Programme (20 Week): The School Internship in teaching/practice teaching of the student-teachers shall be held during the Second Semester and Third Semester. The School Internship Programme of One Month (4 Weeks) duration will be held during the Second Semester and Four Months (Sixteen Weeks) practice teaching of the student-teachers will be held during the Third Semester. During the third semester of the B.Ed. course, the practice teaching shall be of four months (16 weeks) duration. During these sixteen weeks, the candidates are required to deliver 100 lessons (50 in each teaching subject) under the supervision of the teacher educator of the institution. In addition, the student-teachers are required to observe 60 observation lessons (30 in each Teaching Subject) of their peer student-teachers in the concerned teaching subjects. If a candidate, who does not deliver mandatory number of lessons and undertakes any other activities related to teaching practice and practical work, he/she will not be allowed to appear in external assessment of practice teaching (i.e. final teaching practice examination). The macro / practice lessons will be supervised / assessed by the concerned teacher educator and feedback will be provided to the candidates on his/her performance by the school head/ mentor (school teacher) and teacher educator of the institution concerned in which the student is studying.

#### 29. Leave Rules

- i. At least a minimum of 80% Lectures/Tutorial/Practical and a minimum of 90% in School Internship Programme (Phase I and II) are mandatory per semester to all student-teachers to appear in End Semester Examination therefore student teachers are advised to attend their classes/ Internship Programme regularly and punctually.
- ii. In case the student-teacher is unable to attend the Classes/ Internship Programme he/she must apply for any kind of leave on plain paper duly sanctioned by the competent authorities and submit the same in the college office.
- iii. Before proceeding on leave, leave must got sanctioned from the appropriate authority and submitted to the office for further necessary action.
- iv. In case of illness, the leave application must supported by Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital indicating the period advised for the rest. The Medical leave or any other kind leave is not counted towards lectures.
- v. Leave application for working days falling between holidays/holiday prefix and suffix will not be granted.

- vi. Principal is the only competent authority to sanction leaves. Absence will invite fine as mentioned in the prospectus.
- vii. Leave for two days will be sanctioned by the respective tutor of student-teacher. In case of leave for more than two days, it will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the respective tutor of student-teacher.

#### 30. General Rules for Conduct and Discipline

- i. Each student-teacher is expected to show exemplary conduct, politeness, and humbleness, civilized behaviour in college campus and outside the campus.
- ii. Observance of the college rules & regulations is compulsory to student teacher.
- iii. Student-teachers are advised to go thoroughly through this Hand Book of Information and College Notice Board(s) regularly.
- iv. All academic/administrative powers of the institution are vested with the Principal of the college and with the committees duly authorized by the Principal.
- v. Each student-teacher must follow the college Dress Code strictly.
- vi. Each student-teacher is expected to be present regularly in the college.
- vii. No student-teacher is permitted to undertake any part-time/whole-time job during the Two Year B.Ed. Programme.
- viii. Each student-teacher has to make his/her own stay arrangement near the institution.
- ix. All student-teachers are advised to inform about their local residential address to their tutors and to the college office.
- x. No student-teacher is allowed to put posters/ undertake anti social activities in college campus/notice board and not allowed to organize unlawful activities or addressing unauthorized assembly in the college campus.
- xi. No student-teacher is allowed to roam unnecessarily in the college corridors, stairs, in front of classes, Multipurpose Hall, Training/Seminar rooms, library, ICT Labs and Administrative Block (s) etc.
- xii. Silence is to be strictly observed. Student-teachers causing disturbance/obstruction in the smooth functioning are liable for disciplinary action.
- xiii. The Losses/ Damages of college property by student-teacher(s) shall be penalized accordingly.
- xiv. Smoking, drinking of alcohol, use of drugs, tobacco products is strictly prohibited in institution. Any indulgence in the said activities will entail strict disciplinary action/expulsion from the Institution.
- xv. Each student-teacher is expected to maintain a general level of proficiency in academic and

- educational training environment in the institution.
- xvi. Attendance in the Morning Assembly, Yoga, Sports, Club Activities, Cultural Activities, Teaching Practice and other activities is compulsory.
- xvii. For outside Campus Programmes /Educational Tours/Cultural Activities etc. student teachers must seek their guardian/parent's permission/consent to this effect.
- xviii. During working hours student-teachers are not allowed to go out of the college campus except during recess.
- xix. In-service Teachers are required to obtain Duty Certificate from this college for the release of monthly salary from their respective schools if they are on study leave with salary.
- xx. Parents/guardians are expected and advised to keep regular contact with the Principal of the College to know their ward's progress through following modes:

#### 31. Ragging

Ragging is totally banned in the institution and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished accordingly. - iii. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship and other benefits
- iv. Debarring from appearing in exam/other evaluation process
- v. Withholding results
- vi. Debarring the student from representing in any national, international or youth festival.
- vii. Suspension from hostel
- viii. Restriction from institution for a period of 1 to 4 Year
- ix. Expulsion from an institution and barring from admission in any other institution.

## is a punishable offence

## Ragging Means the Following:

Any conduct practice by which dominant power of senior students, former students or outsiders is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled who are in a way considered junior by other students and includes individula of collective acts practices which:

- Involve physical or psychological assault or threat or use of force or wrongful confinement or restrian or
- Violate the status, dignity and honour of such students; or
- Exposes students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem; or
- Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gesture and obscene behaviour.

#### Any student found involved in any ragging activity shall be punished as under:

- 1. Explusion from the college.
- 2. Suspension from the classes
- 3. Fines with public apology.
- 4. Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- 5. Debarring from representation in events.
- 6. Legal proceedings under criminal law shall be initiated.
- 7. *Imprisonment, fine or both.*
- 8. Withholding of result of examination.
