Introduction

Situated at the foothills of the majestic Dhauladhars, Government College of Teacher Education (GCTE) Dharamshala, a premiere educational institute of the region, was established in September, 1956 by the Government to meet the demand of trained teachers in the state and the region. Since its inception, the institution has been catering to the educational needs of Preservice and In-service teachers of the state and adjoining states. It was upgraded from Government College of Education to Government College of Teacher Education by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India on 24th February, 1993. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has re-accredited this institution with 'B' Grade in the second cycle (May, 2015) with CGPA of 2.65. In 2023, the college was again reaccredited for the third cycle by NAAC and was awarded "B++" Grade. The college caters to Pre-service and In-service Teacher Trainings by conducting Induction Programmes, Teacher Training and Capacity Building Programmes, Seminars and Workshops for In-service Teachers and Heads of Educational Institutions of six districts (Chamba, Kangra, Hamirpur, Mandi, Kullu and Lahaul & Spiti) of H.P. Various committees and cells have been established in the college for addressing the needs of the learners viz. Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, Women Grievance Redressal Cell, Career Counselling Guidance and Placement Cell etc. Extensive theoretical orientation supplemented with five months teaching practice/internship provides a healthy learning environment for a holistic and harmonious development of the prospective teachers. Teaching Learning

1. Mode of Teaching

The college employs various modern teaching methods to enhance students' engagement and learning outcomes including:

Blended Teaching: A combination of traditional and digital teaching approaches is implemented.

Flipped Classroom: Learners are introduced to content before class, promoting interactive sessions during contact hours. KIOSK in the college campus acts as an interactive information center promoting digital and online learning by providing access to digital resources, interactive learning and promoting self-paced learning.

Customized Teaching Approaches: Instruction is being provided as per the requirements of different groups of students.

2. Curriculum Planning & Implementation

The institution places significant emphasis on meticulous curriculum planning and timely implementation to ensure the smooth functioning of the academic calendar.

Teaching Schedule and Documentation

One of the fundamental aspects of the curriculum planning process is the preparation and dissemination of the Teaching Schedule. The college follows a structured teaching schedule that includes several essential components like Time Table, Orientation Programme, Seminars, Academic Activities, Co-curricular activities, House examination etc.

Learning Outcomes (LOs)

At Government College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala, the learning outcomes are clearly defined for each course and are in alignment with the prescribed syllabus by the university. The defined learning outcomes are also reflected in lesson planning, instructional design, classroom interaction, and evaluation methods.

Curriculum Enrichment Practices

To enhance the core curriculum and provide experiential learning opportunities, the college incorporates several curriculum enrichment practices. These initiatives go beyond textbook

learning and contribute to the holistic development of teacher trainees. Govt. College of Teacher Education, at its own level enriches the curriculum with the use of different practices

e.g. projects, surveys, educational tours, community work in the surroundings to make the teaching learning process more effective. The key enrichment practices that were carried out during the year were:

Through these enrichment activities, the college fosters experiential, inquiry-based, and socially relevant learning. It provides teacher trainees with opportunities to apply knowledge in practical settings and promotes well-rounded professional growth.

Evaluation Criteria

B.Ed student-teachers are evaluated through Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (20%) and End-Semester Exams (80%) as per university norms. CCA Marks include Mid-Term Exams (15/7 marks) and attendance (5/3) for papers in 100/50 mark papers, respectively. Minimum 80% classroom attendance and 90% internship attendance is mandatory. Shortages are addressed through remedial classes in the campus or extended internship (Phase I and II) in lab schools.

Detail of House Examination

Internal Evaluation/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment is an integral component of B.Ed. Course. In theory Paper, 20% of the total marks are meant for Internal Assessment.

Mid Term Tests/Class Tests: Mid Term Tests are conducted by the Examination Committee after completion of nearly fifty percent of the syllabus in each semester. Class tests are taken by the teacher educators, evaluated, and appropriate immediate feedback is provided to the students for improving their performance.

Student, Support Services and Progression

1. Pre and post admission counselling

HPU conducted the B.Ed. Entrance exam for the session 2024-25 on 20th June 2024. After the declaration of result and the display of respective merit lists on the University Website and student login, the admission schedule was issued by the H.P. University. The process of admissions commenced from 12th August to 17th September 2024 comprising four rounds, inclusive of Sports and Cultural Quota seats and Mop-up Round. In total, 250 seats of Govt. College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala was filled through this process. After each round

of counselling, the candidates are required to visit the allotted college for document

verification.

Govt. College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala had constituted Four committees viz. Arts/Commerce, Non-Medical and Medical, and the final Admission Committee for pre admission guidance and counselling, document verification and final admission. During the process of pre-admission counselling, the students were guided about the various feasible combinations of Teaching Subjects available to each one of the students, which helped them to select appropriate teaching subjects as per their eligibility and interest.

The Induction cum Orientation program for the session 2024-25 was notified on 12th September 2024 via college notice board, College official Whatsapp group, college website and college official Facebook Page and held on 20th September 2024. During this Induction cum Orientation session, different staff members apprised the newly admitted students on various aspects and academic requirements viz. General code of conduct, CSCA constitution and its functions, different committees and labs, University and NCTE rules and regulations, Time table, Library and other facilities and amenities available in the college.

7. Mentor - Mentee groups

The student-teachers of the college are divided into different Microteaching/ Simulation Teaching groups. All the Teacher Educators who are associated with the School Internship Programme are allotted these groups and they act as Mentors to all the Mentees of their respective groups. These groups are designed to provide student-teachers with guidance and support, both academically and personally, to help them succeed in their studies and overall development. A total of 17 such groups were formed for the student-teachers in this session.

8. Capacity Building of students

A series of guest lectures were organized under Extension Activities for the paper *Understanding the Self (XVI)* to support the holistic development of students. Dr. Manoj Kumar served as the in-charge of the program. Four sessions were conducted in May 202. The first session on 16th May focused on "Spiritual Practice (Sahaj Yoga)" and was conducted by Ms. Sfurti Sharma, with 105 students and 8 staff members participating. The next three sessions, held on 19th, 20th, and 21st May, were led by Dr. Vikas Nadda, covering topics such as "Dhyan, Meditation, and Yogasna". Each of these sessions lasted 3 hours and had 40 student participants along with 10 staff members.

9. Career Counseling and Placement Cell

The Cell endeavours to provide a platform, where every student is equipped with the knowledge, skills, and guidance necessary to achieve their career aspirations. The Cell organised a lecture titled "Educators as Nation Builders", which was delivered by Dr. Rashmi Ramoul (Retd. Principal) on 19-11-2024. The Cell also organised a series of Career Oriented activities from 14-05-2025 to 21-05-2025 in which leading educationists, experts and alumni of the college were invited to be actively involved with the students of B. Ed. fourth semester.

Students were trained during these activities for the Placement Drives. Thereafter the college organised a Campus Placement Drive on 22nd and 23rd of May in the college campus. Guru Study center shortlisted 10 students in different subjects. Aadesh International school Hoshiyarpur shortlisted 11 students in different subjects. Delhi Convent School, Dehra also shortlisted 07 students of B. Ed. fourth semester. Prime excess Classes Coaching Institute,

Palampur shortlisted 06 students for their coaching centre. A total of 5 private schools and

educational study centers participated in this placement drive.

10. Student Progression

The student cohort has demonstrated significant progress in their academic and professional qualifications. A substantial portion of the student body has achieved advanced academic qualifications. Almost 50% of the students are already postgraduates. A total of 26 students qualified for the CTET exam, more than 80 students qualified HPTET exam conducted by HPBOSE, 08 students qualified the UGC-NET exam.

Mentor Mentee groups

a) At the commencement of the session, in semester I students are allotted four houses, each house having its own student nominated House Captain and vice-Captain (with equal representation of male and female). Each house has a team of 3-4 Teacher incharges who look after the Psychosocial, Educational, Curricular needs of the students and coordination and organisation of various interhouse competitive and non-competitive activities during the session.  - i) At the completion of each semester, intra college activity and completion of the course,
 - ii) Comprehensive feedback is collected from all the stakeholders regarding all the facilities of the college and suggestions for further improvement and uplifting of the services provided by the institution.

Preservation of nearby water resources

The GCTE Rover and Rangers unit volunteers take active part in the college activities management and have adopted a Bowali (Traditional Water Body) near college constructed in 1934 for its cleanliness and uptake.

Energy conservation

- a) The institution has an effective Energy Conservation, Renewable Energy Promotion Policy promoting use of solar energy for meeting its partial power requirements.
- b) The College and Girls Hostel has replaced all its bulbs and tube lights with LED bulbs and Tubes along with solar lamp posts in the campus and college Girls' hostel. A solar Water Heater is installed in the hostel to reduce power consumption.

Solid Waste Segregation/Management

- a) GCTE has an efficient system of waste collection and disposal and adoption of waste reduction by having an agreement with Municipal Corporation Dharamshala for daily Collection of Segregated Garbage from Campus and Hostel,
- b) Sewerage pipes linked to MC's Sewerage System.
- c) Dry leaves compost bins are installed in the campus the same manure from these bins is used for flower beds in the campus.
- d) Paperless e-dissemination of information amongst the students and staff.
- e) Selling of Scrap paper and junk to recycling units, regular Cleanliness drives in campus and vicinity are organised.
- f) Use of non-biodegradable disposable items is discouraged,
- g) Students and faculty are encouraged to use steel lunch boxes and water bottles as a step to reduce the use of plastic and to create a plastic free campus.
- h) The college has purchased a Shredding Machine to promote environmental sustainability through recycling and repurposing. All kinds of paper, that is of no use, is shredded in the Shredding Machine, which is utilised for DIY activities (compost pile, mulch for gardens etc.) and is also used during Competitive Examination (as packing material) conducted by HPPSC, UPSC, NTA and other agencies.

Rain Water Harvesting

a) The college has a functional Rain Water Harvesting system in the college with 10 Thousand litters storage capacity, which is used to irrigate the flower beds.

Barcoding of Books: The library holds a collection of 18,274 books, with the barcode process for books nearing completion. This allows for easy issuance and return of books through barcode scanning.

The Internship Programme for the B. Ed. Two year programme is divided into 2 phases (First phase: 4 weeks & Second phase: 16 weeks).
